

BIRDING CHECKLIST – ST. LOUIS REGION

This checklist highlights the bird species that have been observed within the confluence of the Mississippi, Missouri and Illinois rivers. This area, part of the Mississippi Flyway, is an important migratory bird habitat and a destination for birders. Be sure to bring along your binoculars and a birding book for reference. (Note: some public lands may be closed to serve as a sanctuary for the wildlife found there.)
